

Summary Ontario QSO Party 2026

The most notable change this year was to score phone QSO points equal to CW points in order to increase participation in the phone sector of the OQP. There was not a large increase in the percentage of phone entries this year, but the increase in mixed entries was six percent. We'll see if the percentages increase next year.

OQP had 24 fewer logs than last year. That was mostly driven by the drop in US logs received. There was an increase of Canadian logs except within Ontario. There were 77 stations that had ten or more contacts with OQP stations, but did not submit a log, 16 of which were in Ontario. Thanks to everyone who got on, made some QSO's and submitted a log. Your participation is appreciated and helps us ensure that the final results are as accurate as possible.

We had five bonus stations assigned – VA3RAC, VE3RHQ, VA3CCO, VE3CCO and VE3ODX, which are worth extra points for each QSO. Two bonus stations VA3RAC and VE3CCO did not operate and we weren't able to get alternate operators on the air in time. Special thanks to VA3YBW, VE3NNT and the RAC HQ station for acting as bonus stations this year.

Contest Club Ontario holds our Annual General Meeting at the end of August. This gives us time to collect logs from the OQP, do all the background stuff – scoring the logs, generating certificates, and getting plaques made up to be handed out at the end of August. For those not able to attend in person to accept their plaque, we do send them out shortly afterwards. Shipping plaques out of Canada has been cost prohibitive (the cost of shipping exceeds the cost of the plaque) so we

have been reluctantly forced to replace out of country plaques with certificates.

A quick e-mail to the submitter usually provided the details required.

We also wish to thank the many folks at Contest Club Ontario who work behind the scenes who help promote the Ontario QSO Party, who compile and score the logs, and deliver the final results. It is very much something we all enjoy, and we enjoy doing our bit to help make contesting a fun event we can all enjoy.
